Repainting of the bridge over Thredbo River, Kosciuszko Road, 7kms west of Jindabyne from Monday 7 December

The NSW Government is funding \$1.5 million for the removal of lead paint and repainting of the bridge over Thredbo River, Kosciuszko Road, 7kms west of Jindabyne.

Roads and Maritime Services will carry out the work which involves blasting to remove lead paint followed by the repainting of the bridge.

We will be working from **Monday 7 to Friday 18 December between 6am and 6pm (work may also occur on weekends)**, weather permitting.

Work will continue after the Christmas break from **Monday 11 January to Friday 13 May between 6am and 6pm, (work may also occur on weekends)** weather permitting. No work will be carried out on the long weekends.

We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

How will the work affect you?

There will be some noise associated with this work. We will make every effort to minimise noise where possible.

Pedestrian access will be provided.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

The bridge will be reduced to one lane throughout the duration of the work.

Wide loads greater than four metres will not be able to cross the bridge or continue along Kosciuszko Road. There are no available detours.

A reduced speed limit of 40km/h will be in place for the safety of workers and motorists.

Delays of no longer than five minutes may be experienced while work is carried out on the bridge.
