It is nearly May - and maybe the last work party for 2018, depending on what gets done, what is left to do and the weather.

Heaps has been done in the earlier WPs. Once it snows, you might not see the work that has been done with the marker poles, rock removal and trail rerouting. But be assured that the work will improve the ability to groom and hold snow on the trails.

You will notice the work done at the Shelter. The old bathroom floors are freshly retiled, a new device charging station has been installed and the exterior steel work has been repainted along with other less-exciting maintenance.

NSW Snowsports XC was recently the recipient of a Sport Development Grant from the NSW Office of Sport to support the supply of a defibrillator to be installed at the Nordic Shelter. Every attempt will be made to purchase, install and complete the required training before the coming winter. Here is hoping that it never needs to be used.

Tasks for this work party will include:

- Poling the new Links (Ted's, Ross's and Carl's Link) to provide new trail options/configurations.
- Installing the drainage half-pipes and covers
- Erecting the safety fence at the back of the Shelter
- The usual pre-winter spring-clean inside and outside the Shelter.

The Snowy Mountains Magazine article contains information on the following initiatives announced by the NSW Government:

a) a new Kosciuszko Iconic Walk from Charlotte Pass via Guthega and Perisher and finishing at the Lake Crackenback Resort. The walk will be 25 kilometres long, cost \$17m and take 4 years to finish, and

b) completing the Thredbo Valley Track in 2019 from Lake Crackenback Resort to Jindabyne and the final touches of the track from Thredbo to Dead Horse Gap in 2020, with \$10 allocated for that purpose.

This is excellent news for the Perisher Range Resorts and the Snowy Mountains generally.

These facilities will assist Clubs to promote lodge usage and to encourage sports.

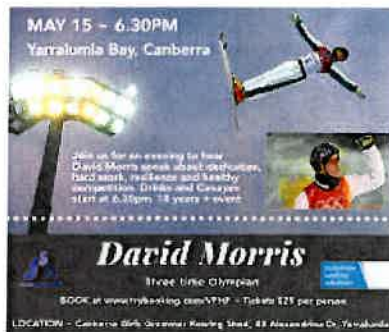

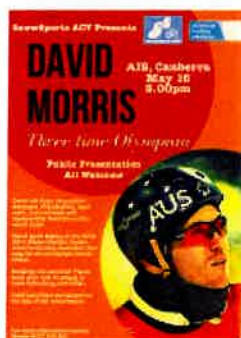

Speaker – David Morris

David Morris made history at the Sochi 2014 Winter Olympic Games when he became Australia's first male to win an Olympic aerials medal. Having made the four-man 'Super Final', Morris landed his quad twisting somersault to score 110.41 and take home the silver medal behind Anton Kushnir from Belarus.

Following Sochi, Morris took a year off from the sport – however, he soon decided to return for his third Olympic Games, this time at PyeongChang 2018.

At the 2018 Games, Morris finished 10th in the men's aerials which saw the 33- year-old narrowly miss out on progressing to the second round.
